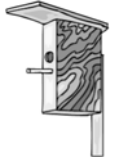




WAYNE COUNTY SWCD FALL 2018 FUNDRAISER



The Wayne County Soil & Water Conservation District is excited about this Fall Fundraiser to help fund educational programs, provide excellent service to the community, and improve the quality of our environment. This year the SWCD is offering a variety of 1 and 3 gallon container grown trees/shrubs, 1 quart and 1 gallon native flowers, kiln dried cedar bird/animal nest boxes & feeders, and 33 gallon rain barrels.

We are working with a new nursery, so items and variety is in **limited quantity** this year, so order early to get what you want!! The SWCD is also continuing to offer durable feeders and nestboxes for a variety of wildlife species. These quality items are made by an Ohio business. Rain barrels are also being offered, made by reusing barrels from Indiana American Water.

Wayne County Soil & Water Conservation District Rain Barrels

Thank you for your interest in one of our rain barrels! It has been made possible by the Wayne County Foundation's Challenge Match Grant awarded to the District do educational outreach within our community. The funds from the Grant allow us to purchase the hardware and materials needed to turn the plastic barrels into rain barrels.



Barrels are donated to the SWCD and are washed out and rinsed before use. We do suggest another rinsing when you get home to get the remaining suds out (we wash them out at the car wash, but with two small holes at the top to work with we do not always get all the water out before you pick it up. Barrels have come from sources including Indiana American Water Company here in Richmond. Thank you so much!

It is suggested that the rain barrel set up on some blocks to allow easy access to attaching a garden hose for use. The accordion downspout allows for attachment to a current downspout. When it turns cold in the fall be sure to remove the rain barrel from the downspout and drain it before storing for the winter.

Rain Barrels – why use one?

Rain barrels have been around for years and are making a recent comeback. Collecting the rain can be beneficial not only in times of drought to water your plants, but also a way to save money on your water bill AND help the environment.

Collecting rain water from the roof of your house tends to be cleaner if you keep your roof free of debris, and it is better for your plants' and the soil's health. Treated "city water" and hard water from a well may create an imbalance in the soil if used a lot over time.

By using the water collected in the rain barrel to water your plants it will save you money on your water and/or electric bill, especially during those peak months during the summer when demands for both of these resources are high.

Water naturally will soak into the soil, but in so many of our living and working areas, the soil has been covered with an impervious surface (a hard surface that does not allow water to soak through it). Driveways, roofs, patios, sidewalks, streets, and parking lots are just some examples of impervious surfaces. Water quickly runs off these surfaces, carry pollutants with it, and is deposited into a storm drain or a local stream or river – carry all those pollutants with it and hurting/killing the aquatic life that depends on that water for their habitat.
