

Hummingbirds 6-pack



Hairy Penstemon is a light purple colored trumpet shaped flower that is attractive to bumblebees, hummingbirds, and butterflies.
Mature height: 2-3 feet-
Blooms: May to June
Light: sun - shade
Site: moist to dry soils



Monkey Flower has a lavender snapdragon-like flower. It is visited by both bees and hummingbirds. The flower resembles a grinning monkey face—pinch the sides and the monkey will laugh!
Mature height: 2-4 feet
Blooms: July-September
Light: full sun
Site: moist to wet soils



Obedient Plant has pink tubular/snapdragon like flowers that will attract bumblebees and hummingbirds. Name comes from the flower's ability to stay put when moved to a different position.
Mature height: 2-4 feet
Blooms: August-September
Light: full sun to partial shade
Site: moist soils



Royal Catchfly The brilliant red flowers makes hummingbirds flock to this plant. Sticky glands cover the plant and small insects often become trapped, hence the name Catchfly.
Mature height: 2-4 feet
Blooms: July-August
Light: full sun
Site: moist soils



Wild Bergamot is an easy growing plant with its light purple blooms. It has a distinctively aromatic foliage as it is in the mint family. Bergamot is a favorite of butterflies, bees and hummingbirds!
Mature height: 2-4 feet
Blooms: July—August
Light: full sun
Site: moist soils



Wild Columbine is a beautiful red and yellow downward facing flower that is quite attractive to hummingbirds and bumblebees. Deer and rabbits tend to leave this plant alone due to toxic foliage.
Mature height: 2-3 feet
Blooms: May—June
Light: sun-shade
Site: moist—well drained soils
